- a) Kathy It has been a slow season at PEPtBO. Owing to the mild temperatures, birds are not heading south so numbers are down. We've seen only one white-crowned sparrow, surprisingly a flying squirrel was caught in a net, five types of owls have been banded, ground traps are empty, only one week left for owls.
- b) Cannot confirm, but neighbour claims sighting of cougar west of Frankford
- c) At Point Anne, hanging from large knothole, couldn't identify what looked like long prickly strands. May be wild cucumber or an insect gall? Will try to get a picture.
- d) Juvenile red-headed woodpecker spotted near Tweed (saw two last year)
- e) Every year there is a peregrine falcon at the new Courthouse on Bridge Street. You may see it around 4 p.m., up near ventilation opening on south side.
- f) Redwing blackbirds at feeders
